In English, the children will be using Aaron Becker's 'The Journey' as a stimulus to explore narrative writing within our sentence stacking lessons. These areas of learning will be delivered at a level suitable to the individual.

In science, the children will be learning about lights and electricity. In history, they will learn about the Romans, including their legacy and impact on life today. The art unit focuses on collage and mosaics. In geography, the pupils will be learning about national parks in the UK. R.E. lessons will teach children about Mohammed, Islamic ways of life and the Qur'an. In design and technology, the children will be creating a healthy snack. P.E. this term includes athletics, gymnastics, fundamental movement skills, outdoor and adventurous activities (OAA) and leadership. Relationships are addressed through P.S.H.E. In computing sessions, the pupils will learn about E-Safety, understanding the impact the internet has on everybody and how to write algorithms.

Music involves visits from our toots expert tutor. The children will be developing their knowledge of toots and how they can use them to play, compose and personalise their music.

#### **HOMEWORK**

In KS2, homework will be set weekly on Thursdays to be returned the following Tuesday. The tasks will alternate between English and maths activities. Additionally, pupils will be expected to practise multiplication tables in preparation for weekly tests and revise number bonds to 20, 50 and 100. **Not forgetting the expectation that your child reads to an adult at least four times a week.** 

#### **EDUCATIONAL VISITS**

The children will be visiting Colchester Castle this term. They will be taking part in different activities based on Romans in Britain. The Year 3/4 trip will take place on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> October 2022. More details about this trip will follow shortly.

It's that time of year again – well, almost! Year 3 and 4 will hold their Christmas Concert at St Peter's Church on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December at 2pm. Further details about tickets will follow in due course.
