## **UNIFORM**

R.E. studies will focus on Christianity and being a member of the community, as well as the Jewish home. Our art unit '3D people in action' allows children to develop their sculpting skills and techniques. Athletics, gymnastics and multi-skills, will be taught in

P.E. and the weather and seasons in French. During the first weeks back, our focus will be on PSHE and RSE curriculum; topics covered include: mental wealth, respect, valuing diversity, relationships and friendship.
