### Mini Day Of Action and Year 5 School Speed Watch session

The Safer Essex Road Partnership paid a visit to the year 5 pupils this month, during which the pupils, along with police officers and road safety staff, observed the speeds of vehicles on the road outside their school. During the session, <u>7</u> speeding drivers were pulled over and the year 5's had the opportunity to question the drivers about the dangers and consequences of speeding. The top speed along the 30-mph road was recorded at <u>39mph</u>. Prior to the speed watch, police officers monitored driving conduct approaching the School Crossing patrol.

We appreciate every motorist who followed the law by parking safely and keeping within the speed limit, as well as all who observed the stop sign for the School Crossing Patrol.
