Key Stage One Home Learning

Home learning tasks are set in order to support the learning that they are completing in school in:

- Reading
- Writing
- Maths

Occasionally, half term projects will be set with a focus on one of the foundation subjects.

Reading

Children should be reading with an adult at least 4 times a week – this is linked to a reward system that is run across the school.


- Children should read their book twice (decoding and understanding). This stands until they have reached turquoise level.
- Spend time discussing the story/text and asking each other questions. We need to help their fluency as well as their understanding.

Reading Records

- Please record in your child's Reading Record each time they read with an adult.
- Please be specific and state what page they have reached. If your child needs to change their book (read twice until Turquoise level), we kindly ask for parents to draw a simple outline of a book to remind your child to change it the following morning.
 - It is also beneficial to occasionally include details of how they have read (expression, prediction).

Phonics Homework

- Each week, children will be given a phonics task to complete (set via Google Classroom) using words relating to their phonics.
- It will involve sorting words into the correct groups and then writing a sentence (or a few sentences) that include the given words.
- Although the children should be able to achieve this independently, going through the work with an adult at the time/after is a great opportunity for learning!
- Year 2 complete the same activity but at a higher level.



Challenge Me Cards

Help with mental maths.

The cards cover a range of mental skills the children need to know by the end of key stage (number fluency, shape, time etc.)

- The children complete their cards on a fortnightly basis with a volunteer.
- The children begin with number bond focused cards. They move onto the 4 yellow cards which are more generic.

Multiplication and division

- Multiplication year 1 children should know by heart at least their 2, 5 and 10 times tables by the end of the year.
- Multiplication and division year 2 children should know by heart at least their 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables and division facts by the end of the year.

For children in year 2 who have completed all 4 challenge cards, they will receive a multiplication and division card to practise at home.
