### UNIFORM

# Foundation Subjects

During science lessons, children will be looking at evolution and inheritance, as well as life cycles and life processes. Throughout these units, pupils will be developing their skills in scientific investigation. This term's computing will involve recording and editing videos-building towards more fluid digital literacy. E-Safety will be taught throughout the year at the start of each unit to ensure that children are continually aware of its importance.



In history and geography, the Canvey Floods will be studied to enable children to appreciate the experiences of people in the local area.

R.E. studies will focus on how and why religion brings peace and conflict. Our art unit '3D people in action' allows children to develop their sculpting skills and techniques. Netball, gymnastics and dodgeball will be taught in P.E.



During the first weeks back, our focus will be on PSHE and the new RSE curriculum; topics covered include: mental health, respect, valuing diversity, relationships and friendship. The children will be studying jazz in music and the weather and seasons in French.

### HOMEWORK

In Upper Key Stage 2, homework will be set weekly on <u>Thursdays for maths and English</u>. The sheets will be handed out to the children. These sheets should then be handed in by the following <u>Tuesday</u>. The expectation is that the children should complete as much as they can within 40 minutes for each subject.
