

## EYFS $\rightarrow$ YEARS 1 and 2 $\rightarrow$ YEARS 3 and 4 $\rightarrow$ YEARS 5 and 6

Children will begin to move rhythmically and imitate movement in response to music. They will tap out simple repeated rhythms.

They will explore and learn how sounds can be changed using everyday objects and musical instruments.

They will begin to build a repertoire of songs and dances.

Pupils will use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.

They will play tuned and untuned instruments musically.

They will listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music.

They will experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the interrelated dimensions of music.

Pupils will learn about the notes C, G, E, A and notation lengths of crotchets, quavers, minims and semibreves Pupils will begin to play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments.

They will begin to improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the interrelated dimensions of music.

They will listen and recall sounds with increasing aural memory.

They will begin to use and understand staff (stave) and other musical notations: quavers, crochets, dotted crotchets and minims.

They will use the notes C,D,E,F,G,A with only 4 in use at a time.

Pupils will play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.

They will improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the interrelated dimensions of music.

They will listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory.

They will use and understand staff (stave) and other musical notations: quavers, dotted crotchets, minims, dotted minims and rests. They will use the notes C,D,E,F,G,A,B.

They will begin to appreciate and understand a range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians.
